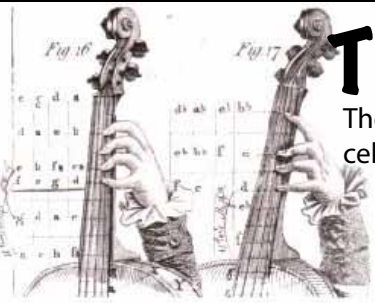

Cellists currently scheduled to give classes include Catharina Meints (Oberlin College/Conservatory, Cleveland Orchestra), Mark Kosower (new Principal Cellist of The Cleveland Orchestra), and Paul Kushious (Cleveland Orchestra). It's a wonderful opportunity to perform, get another viewpoint, and hear words of wisdom from other professionals. Of course, we also encourage non-performing cellists to come and listen and take advantage of the chance to see master teachers in action. A pianist will be provided for each class. To participate, cello students must be recommended by their private teacher. The afternoon will conclude with a reception allowing Cleveland area cellists a little mix and mingle time.
